#### Thought for the month, by Revd David Cattle

This month, in our 10am services, we are continuing with our preaching series on Paul's letter to the Colossians. It's a great letter – really inspiring stuff. And I recommend reading through the whole thing in one sitting, and then doing that again. It's really good!

In chapter 1, Paul says that God has "rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves." In other words, when we believed the Gospel and accepted Jesus into our lives, we moved from a place where God is absent (darkness), to a place where God is present (light).

Of course, God is never completely absent. Every human being alive has been made by God and is loved by God, even people who we think are really nasty pieces of work. God's Holy Spirit works in all people, whatever their beliefs or lifestyles. So we should not take Paul completely literally here.

Instead, as with a lot of the Bible, Paul sets before us 2 extreme situations in order to make the point that one is much better than the other.

Those of us who follow Jesus Christ have something wonderful, something that other people don't have. We are the people who know that God is love, and that his love for each one of us is immense. We know that Jesus has died for our sins and so we are forgiven. We know that Jesus rose on the third day, thus conquering death, and giving us hope for life beyond death. We know the Holy Spirit is active, and so we can work with him to become better people.

So we have the resources and the potential to live lives of joy, hope and purpose, because we know that no matter how bad life gets, God is always with us, and that in the end all things will be well.

Let's praise God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has saved us.
