Churchyard Tidy-Up

We are so fortunate to have a beautiful churchyard. We are grateful to those families who lovingly tend the grave of their loved ones. We are also grateful to our volunteers and paid grounds-team, who work so hard to care for this beautiful place. David, Anne and Travers (the Churchyard Care Team) are currently drafting helpful leaflets which explain the laws of the churchyard, and which help people to apply for headstones, reserve burial plots, and place memorial benches. We are also working on signs that can be displayed in the churchyard. There are currently many items on graves that are not allowed under the law (e.g. borders, loose stones, vases, pots, tablets, ornaments, etc.). So, over the summer we plan to send the new leaflet "The Churchyard Code" to families for whom we have contact details, and we will encourage people to remove those items from their loved one's grave which are not allowed. Getting the balance right between caring for our grieving families, and upholding the law so that what happens is fair for everyone, is a sensitive and demanding task, as well as being a huge piece of work, and one for which we will no doubt be criticised for on social media; so please pray for our Churchyard Care Team.

Thought for the Month by Revd David Cattle

Faith and Trust in Jesus

How wonderful it is to read the Gospels! In my own Bible reading I am currently working my way through Luke's Gospel; at the recent school Leavers' service I preached on the story of Jesus and Peter walking on the water from Matthew's Gospel; and this coming Sunday (at the time of writing) I am preaching on a section of Mark's Gospel at St Luke's Church in Moulsham. (John's Gospel is also wonderful, and is many people's favourite of the four, and I am sure I will be back there soon enough.)

When people who are new to reading the Bible ask me where to start, I often say Mark's Gospel. This is because it is the shortest of the four Gospels, and is faced-paced and punchy. It doesn't have the Christmas stories, but it is still a great introduction to Bible. My passage for this Sunday is Mark 6:34-34 and 53-end. The Church of England lectionary (the official list of readings set for each day) has put these 2 separate passages together because they both show how people responded to Jesus:

He had tried to get away to a quiet place to get some rest and prayer time, so he and his disciples had set off across Lake Galilee in a boat. But the crowd figured out where they were going, and they got there on foot ahead of them! And then later, at a different place on the shore of lake, the crowds again recognised him and brought all who were sick so that he could heal them.

The crowds in both places knew that they needed Jesus, above all others. They did everything they could to get close to him, even walking to a deserted place to find him. They prioritised getting to him so that they could hear his teaching and be healed of their diseases, and so that they could bring their loved ones to be healed. They would not have had a fully formed Christian faith, of course, but they did respond to him in faith and trust. When we have this kind of faith and trust in Jesus, we can be assured that he will have compassion for us, just like he had compassion for those crowds on the shores of Lake Galilee. He said that those crowds were like sheep without a shepherd. We now know that Jesus is our Shepherd, and that we can rely on him for the forgiveness of our sins, for our eternal salvation, for the teaching that we need to bring us life, and for the healing of our lives.
