Churchyard Care

We are so fortunate to have a beautiful churchyard, which is lovingly cared for by our volunteers, paid grounds-team, and those who tend the graves of their loved ones. David, Anne and Travers (the Churchyard Care Team) have recently designed information leaflets, to help people to apply for headstones, reserve burial plots, and place memorial benches. We are also designing signs which will shortly be put up around the churchyard. These things also explain the laws regarding what is allowed to be placed on graves in churchyards in this Diocese. There are currently many items in our churchyard which are not allowed under the law (e.g. borders, loose stones, vases, pots, ornaments, tablets, etc.). We will very soon be sending the new leaflet "The Churchyard Code" to those for whom we have contact details, and we will encourage people to remove those items which are not allowed under the law. Getting the balance right between caring for our grieving families, and upholding the law so that what happens is fair and safe for everyone, is a sensitive and demanding task, as well as being a huge piece of work, and one for which we will, no doubt, be criticised on social media; so please pray for our Churchyard Care Team.

Church, Churchyard and Copse Tidy-Ups

We are pausing the 2nd Saturdays' tidy-ups for the winter. There will still be jobs to do outside - mainly leaves. For inside the main emphasis will be cobwebs on windows, window sills, and high up as well as mopping and hoovering the creche room floor. O little town of Bethlehem, How still we see thee lie...

A favourite carol sung by many in the Christmas season. The author, Phillips Brooks spent Christmas 1866 in Bethlehem and wrote this 2 years later for his Sunday School. David was anointed King in Bethlehem. His job as the youngest son was to look after the sheep in the fields there. It is not surprising that he wrote the 23rd Psalm- the Lord is my shepherd.

The shepherds in the fields at Bethlehem were the first to hear the Angelic Announcement that Jesus, the Saviour had been born and they hurried to find him lying in a manger; as a result, they praised and glorified God.

Bethlehem was crowded that night as we know there was no room in the inn. It then suffered destruction when Jerusalem was destroyed in AD 70 by the Romans. When Emperor Constantine was converted he commissioned the building of the Church of the Nativity and grotto. After it was destroyed by fire Emperor Justinian reconstructed it in the 6th century and it has been used for worship ever since. When Phillip Brooks went there in 1866 it would have been a very sleepy place under the Ottomans.

When we were there in 1977, it was full of tourists and pilgrims on Christmas Eve, wanting to look into the grotto, and people singing carols 'We hear the Christmas angels, the great glad tidings tell. O come to us abide with us our Lord Emmanuel'.

What about now with the war in Israel, Gaza and Lebanon still going on? Bethlehem is now in the West Bank with a largely Moslem population but there are still some Christians living and working there. Our Bethlehem Carol Sheets support 'Embrace the Middle East'- a Christian charity involved in education, health care and community projects. The Palestinian Bible Society is working there. The SAT-7 (Christian satellite ministry) reminded me there is a Bible College there and Bethlehem students are spreading Christ's fragrance. Local Bethlehem children are still acting out the nativity scene. Yes, Bethlehem will still be a lot quieter this Christmas as the tourists will not be there but the Gospel message is still going out. Pray for the people living there and for the message that goes out from SAT-7 with a schedule of Christmas programmes that points viewers to the Prince of Peace.
