Visit of Bogi Kozma, 22nd January

Bogi Kozma will be visiting us from Budapest, Hungary where she works contacting Jewish people and explaining Biblical passages to them and showing them the way of salvation through faith in Jesus, the Messiah.

She will be showing us through a visual demonstration of a Passover meal how the Jewish festival of Passover foreshadows the death of Jesus for us on the Cross. This was the last Passover meal He had with his disciples and why we remember His body broken for us and His blood shed for us in our Communion service.



Thought for the month by Travers Harpur:

Enabled or Disabled?

Let's start with "Enabled" as it less complicated than "Disabled"!

I look back gratefully to Stephanie Gillingham and her time as a curate for the way she enabled me to take funerals. She not only opened the way and guided me along the road but gave me that push that sent me out on my own. It helped me to understand what enabling involved – encouragement, mentoring through the early stages and then giving independence. Think of a child learning to walk; times to help and times to stand back.

Scripture talks of enabling; sometimes God or our Lord Jesus enables and of course, all enabling ultimately comes from God (see 1 Timothy 1:12 and Philippians 4:13 – some translations use "strengthen" but the word is basically enable or empower). We see it in examples like St Paul and young Timothy, Barnabas and John Mark, Eli and Samuel as well as Jesus and his disciples.

Sometimes we not only fail to enable but *disable*- by preventing opportunity, by not encouraging, by not training and by not standing back.

Are we enablers in the church? Am I blocking someone? There is a role for all.

Disabled leads to wider issues. Sometimes we just know we don't have the gift (I know I can't sing!) but sometimes it is circumnavigable. We are encouraged to regard people as 'disabled people', rather than 'people with a disability'. The former opens the possibility of enabling – opening up, for example, for those with hearing or sight needs. A group is starting to think about dementia-friendly measures in our church. We can also be disabled by discouragement, by not being used or by overuse.

We can all seek to enable and to avoid disabling. It means I need to consider the needs of others so that not only do they benefit, but then in turn, more people benefit from them.
