## Confirmation Courses – starting on 5<sup>th</sup> June

Confirmation is an important part of someone's journey of faith in the Church of England (other denominations do equivalent things). Confirmation is a service in which someone affirms the promises made during their baptism (either by parents and godparents on their behalf, or by themselves). The service is led by one of our Bishops, who prays for each candidate, "Confirm, O Lord, your servant with your Holy Spirit."

For those who would like to be confirmed, or who would like to explore confirmation, we are holding a 3-session preparation course on Wednesday afternoons for secondary-school-aged young people, and a 5-session course on Wednesday evenings for adults, starting on June 5th. We cover lots of aspects of the Christian faith, as well as many contemporary topics, and you can ask the Vicar your hardest questions about faith, the universe and everything! The course is also good for those who are considering being baptised. See David for more details.

Love your Burial Ground Week and Churches Count on Nature Week is being held the same week, Saturday 8 to Saturday 16 June 2024. We will look at creating some wildflower areas in the Churchyard and Copse, put in more wildlife boxes such as for hedgehogs and start a species count for plants and wildlife.

### **SONlight and MEGA**

As part of 'Churches Count On Nature' Week, SONlight and MEGA will be in the Copse for their session on Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> June. We will be celebrating creation, focusing on the brilliant wildlife found in our outdoor spaces, counting and identifying plants and insects and enjoying s'mores around the firepit. We will be out, whatever the weather, so bring a coat/old trainers, if it looks like rain!

### **Churchyard Summer Tidy-Up**

We are so fortunate to have a beautiful churchyard. We are grateful to those families who lovingly tend the grave of their loved ones. We are also grateful to our volunteers and paid grounds-team, who work so hard to care for this beautiful place.

Everything that happens in the churchyard is covered by a set of rules, which are set by the Diocese of Chelmsford, and come to us as part of a legal framework so they are part of the law of the country. In the past, the Church has not always been good at telling people what the rules are. So, in recent times the Churchyard Care Team (Anne, Travers and David) have been hard at work designing a new leaflet called "The Churchyard Code", which explains the rules. We are also working on signs that we will put up around the churchyard.

In the next few weeks, we will send The Churchyard Code to all of the families for whom we have contact details, and we will encourage people to remove those items from their loved one's grave which are not allowed under the rules (e.g. vases, pots, stones, tablets, ornaments, etc.) over the summer, so that by September the churchyard is much more compliant with the law.

One reason that some items are not allowed is that they are not biodegradable, and we want the churchyard to be as "green" as possible, especially now that we have just received our Silver Eco Church Award. If you have any questions about this, please see a member of the Churchyard Care Team. Thanks.

### Praying Together in Church on a Wednesday

# Thought for the Month by Anne Pepper:

# Caring for God's Creation – How do I play my part?

We are delighted to announce that St Michaels has recently been awarded its Eco-Church Silver award! This is great news and congratulations to Richard and his team who have worked so hard on our behalf, to achieve this goal. This achievement has focused our minds on this aspect of our Christian Life. In Genesis 2:15 we are told

The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it.

Work it and take care of it. Not misuse it, deplete it or destroy it, but to conserve and renew it. We are stewards of God's creation. But we are clear that we worship the Creator – God Himself and not Creation itself. In Psalm 24:1 we are told

## The Earth is the Lord's and everything in it.

We are not the owners of creation but its stewards and we must approach our stewardship of creation with humility and caution.

So what are we doing? This month in June we are starting to conduct a survey of the plant and wildlife of our Copse and Churchyard. On Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June our Upwards Youth group will begin the first steps of the plant and wildlife survey. On Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> June we have the Big Help Out (10am-3pm) in the Copse and the Churchyard (see above) and on Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> during the morning service our children and young people will begin their part of the plant and wildlife survey. Over the summer holiday our school-age children are using the theme of creation throughout their programme on Sunday mornings and will be building bug hotels amongst many other things.

As part of our Eco journey, we are swapping to recycled paper, using more eco-friendly products in the kitchen and as part of cleaning, and also moving to use more Fairtrade items. We are looking at a more sustainable mowing and grass-cutting regime that hopefully achieves a good balance between leaving some areas more wild, and tending other areas to allow use of the churchyard and access to graves. We won't crack it this year, but hopefully we will build and learn how best to manage this balance from year to year.

So what could you do? Join in on Saturday 8 June 10am-3pm. Volunteer your expertise if you are knowledgeable on plants or animals. Do you have artistic skills to record our plant and wildlife findings to make display boards for the churchyard? Can you help us draw up an artistic Impression of what areas of the Copse and Churchyard should look like when they are stewarded well?

I hope this has given you a flavour of what is very much the start of our journey.
