#### Full Revision of the Electoral Roll

Every year, we update our Electoral Roll in time for the Annual Parochial Church Meeting. The Electoral Roll is the official Church membership list, which all Church of England churches need to compile. This year we need to do a full revision of the Roll, which means that if you would like your name to be on the Roll you need to fill in an application form, even if your name is currently on it. And for those who are not yet members of the Roll, please consider joining. If you join the Roll:

1. You can vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, at which we elect PCC members.

2. You can stand for election to be the PCC member or as a Churchwarden.

3. You make a statement about belonging - that this is your Church family.

You can join the Roll if you are baptised, and are aged 16 or over, and are resident in the Parish OR worship with us regularly (or would worship with us, but are prevented perhaps because of age or illness). The closing date for applications is Sunday 20th April (Easter Sunday). There will be paper copies of the application form at the back of Church. # Thought for the Month by Jane Windus:

# Love One Another

'A new command I give to you: "Love one another. As I have loved you so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."' John 13:34 - 35

Such a challenging command! To love in this context is an action, not a feeling. We live in a world which values living for self, doing things which make you feel good and not being concerned when they adversely affect others. Jesus turned those values on their head and said, 'show your love for each other because then people of the world will see that your values are different.' A small pastoral team is currently being set up and once paperwork and checks are made, it will be putting this command into practice and serving others. We will be visiting/phoning those in our church family who are sick, lonely or just needing a chat or a prayer. Yet, this command is for *all* the church family to be involved in, and not just a few. Whether you are having a coffee at the Saturday coffee mornings or indeed any other church meeting, including our Sunday morning services, we should be looking out for new people to welcome, or those we know who are going through difficult times, and just coming alongside them to give encouragement and support. When people feel loved and valued, they in turn will feel moved to help others. Sometimes we are called to go through really awful experiences, but we could use them to bring comfort to others facing similar experiences.

Every day we are given 24 gold coins. These coins are priceless, nothing on earth can match their value. They are not transferrable; they are ours and ours alone. We cannot save them up for a rainy day or invest them to make more. We can squander them or use them wisely; the choice is solely ours to do with them what we like. BUT, one day, we will not be given our full quota, and on that day, we will be called to account before the King of Kings, as to what we have done with all those coins we have been blessed with over our lifetime. May we have no regrets! So let us all rise to the challenge and show our love to one another, that the world may know we belong to Him.
