Church Electoral Roll revision

Every year we update our Electoral Roll. This is the official Church membership list, which all Church of England churches need to compile. If your name is already on the Electoral Roll, you don't need to do anything – you will stay on automatically (unless you would like to come off; if so, please contact us). If you are not yet on the Electoral Roll, please do consider joining.

I would recommend joining the Roll because:

- 1. It allows you to vote at our Annual Meeting, which takes place on Sunday 21st May this year.
- 2. It allows you to stand for election to the PCC or Churchwarden.
- 3. It is about belonging. It is a way of saying, this is my Church family and I belong here. You can join the Roll if you are:
 - 1. Aged 16 or over.
 - 2. Resident in the parish OR worship with us regularly (or would usually worship with us, but are prevented from coming to Church, perhaps because of age or illness).

There are set dates for the revision of the Roll. The revision opens on Sunday 9th April (Easter Sunday) and closes on Sunday 30th April. Thought for the Month by Revd David Cattle

I'm starving!

We are into the season of Lent. My plan this year is the give up chocolate for the 40 days plus 6 Sundays that make up this season. I made the mistake in Church last Sunday morning of asking if someone could save me a KitKat. I was at the back of Church after the service, about to eat the KitKat, when my 7-year old daughter Sophia reminded me that I have given up chocolate. It's a good job she was there! (Although, it doesn't stop her waving her own chocolate under my nose at every opportunity!)

I am also fasting during one lunch-time each week, and spending that time in prayer. Today, as I write this, it is my fasting day. I have just been for a lovely walk outside - I find walking helps me to pray (maybe it's the exercise, or maybe the fresh air). I am also feeling really hungry, and my mind is wandering to what I feast I can cook for dinner tonight! What's the point of making myself hungry? Fasting is an act of devotion to God. It's not a way to get into God's good books – we are in God's good books because of his love for us, and because of Jesus's death on the cross for us, not because we can impress him or put him in our debt. (God owes us nothing.) His love for us is a free gift, as true love must always be.

Fasting is an act of devotion to God – a way of drawing closer to him. As part of this, it is a way of mastering our desires, practicing self-control, and training our spiritual muscles, so that when temptation comes we are more able to follow God's path, even if that path is hard, and to resist what might feel good but would ultimately be bad for us and for other people. It's good to train our spiritual muscles, because the devil never sleeps. I was preaching a sermon on the prophet Joel recently, for one of our joint services with our partner churches, and one thing that struck me is that Joel follows a pattern that we often see in the Old Testament prophets: God promises to judge his people Israel, he calls them to repent, and then he promises to restore them, save them and bless them. Since these 3 things – threat of judgement, command to repentance, promise of salvation – occur so often in the prophets, they must be very important to God. And this leads me to think that we should take them more seriously than we do.

(1) The Judgement of God. We must remember that God is good and holy, and sin is a profound problem. (2) God's command to repentance. God wants us to turn from our sin and turn back to him, each and every day and in each and every situation. Pray for forgiveness, and ask for help to do better. (3) God will forgive us and save us. He loves us and wants a friendship with us. He knows all about our sin, he knows we will sin in the future, and still loves us. This is grace – God gives us what we don't deserve and could not earn. Or, as I have heard it described: GRACE = "God's Riches At Christ's Expense". It's up to us what we do for Lent, or whether we do anything at all. But I would urge all of us to do something that brings these 3 things to mind – judgement, repentance and salvation.
