We have been delighted to welcome many new faces to St Michael's since the pandemic. We are accordingly planning a special welcome lunch for our new members after one Sunday morning service in early spring. Details will follow in due course.

Churchyard Care

We are so fortunate to have a beautiful churchyard, which is lovingly cared for by our volunteers, paid grounds-team, and those who tend the graves of their loved ones. David, Anne and Travers (the Churchyard Care Team) have recently designed information leaflets, to help people to apply for headstones, reserve burial plots, and place memorial benches. We are also designing signs which will shortly be put up around the churchyard. These things also explain the laws regarding what is allowed to be placed on graves in churchyards in this Diocese. There are currently many items in our churchyard which are not allowed under the law (e.g. borders, loose stones, vases, pots, ornaments, tablets, etc.). We will very soon be sending the new leaflet "The Churchyard Code" to those for whom we have contact details, and we will encourage people to remove those items which are not allowed under the law. Getting the balance right between caring for our grieving families, and upholding the law so that what happens is fair and safe for everyone, is a sensitive and demanding task, as well as being a huge piece of work, and one for which we will, no doubt, be criticised on social media; so please pray for our Churchyard Care Team.

Church, Churchyard and Copse Tidy-Ups

We are pausing the 2nd Saturdays' tidy-ups for the winter. There will still be jobs to do outside - mainly leaves. For inside the main emphasis will be cobwebs on windows, window sills, and high up as well as mopping and hoovering the creche room floor. Thought for the Month by Travers Harpur:

Chris Fox

The longstanding link between St. Michaels Galleywood and the Evangelical church in Piotrkow was established about 25 years ago by Chris Fox of EPIC (European Partners in Christ). Sadly, Chris died on 24th September after a severe illness that prevented her travelling to Eastern Europe this spring. Her memorial service is on Thursday 31st October in Bildeston, Suffolk, where she lived for many years.

Chris worked tirelessly to help various churches in Poland, Czech Republic, Romania, Bosnia and Bulgaria. Her final tour of Eastern Europe was in October 2023 and referred to in her Prayer Letter (copies available from me). Chris originally worked for European Christian Mission and travelled for them behind the Iron Curtain in Communist days. Later she established EPIC and carried on her links with that part of the world. For many believers she was their support and conduit for aid.

Jane and I travelled three times with her, once in 2012 to Romania and the former Soviet republic of Moldova, Chris driving us around. Other trips with her were to Bulgaria, Macedonia, Bosnia and Serbia. In most destinations she was the key to many pastors and congregations, we were usually 'hangers on' or guest speaker though we did introduce her to a Serbian Orthodox priest we knew from earlier travels! Chris was slow to appear 'at the front' and when it came to photographs, she disappeared. Often Chris travelled across Europe on her own, driving long days in difficult areas. She will be missed but hopefully links like ours with Piotrkow will continue as meaningful to both parties.

Chris' dedication and perseverance was an example to me and her simple lifestyle and commitment to her 'flock' was challenging. Humanly speaking she was a 'loner' but her commitment to her Lord and Saviour meant she was not alone. Loving care flowed from her for those to whom she ministered. I am sure she is hearing 'well done, good and faithful servant'. Till we meet again
